PASTOR'S PAGE

The Four Columns of Thyatira, Past, Present, and Future

As you have probably heard by now, Thyatira has a new Mission Statement that links our church with the first Thyatira church described in Revelation 2: "Thyatira Presbyterian Church – A Living Legacy of Love, Faith, Service, and Patient Endurance." As I shared in October while taking a look at the Biblical passages that mention Thyatira, I like to think of these four virtues as the columns on which rest everything else our church does. They are our foundation.

While on one hand, a Mission Statement is a valuable tool because it helps us always to remember who we are, it is also merely a collection of words at the bottom of the Sunday bulletin if we do not live it out. Our ancestors in the faith at Thyatira have done so for the last 260+ years, and we hope our children and grandchildren will as well, so this generation too must do its part to remain true to the identity God has given us.

During worship in December, members of the Vision Discernment Team, the group charged with involving everyone at Thyatira with uncovering God's dream for our future, have been sharing their thoughts about these four columns. We are reprinting them in the newsletter so, especially if you didn't have the chance to hear them in worship (but even if you did!), please give their words your prayerful attention. Everything we do going forward to fulfill God's desires in this place will depend on how well we practice our love, faith, service, and patient endurance.

The Column of Love by Greg Hager

On behalf of the vision team, I am here to speak to you a moment about the importance of love to the future of Thyatira. We here are blessed to build on our long history as a house of God, but we want to focus on what will allow Thyatira to continue to grow and be relevant in the future. We can't rest on pride in our past accomplishments. We have to decide how to move into the future. There are many questions for the modern church and the answers aren't always easy to sort out. But we have a command from Jesus himself. "As I have loved you, so you must love one another."

It's essential, not optional. It's a command. Just in case his disciples didn't get it, he showed them by washing their feet. We must love and support and care for each other if we want to be an effective witness to the world. We can't be divided or territorial or selfish. We are called to love each other. We can only show God's love to the world if we live it in our own family here.

"By this, all will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."

The first step to Thyatira's future is to love one another. Jesus said so to his disciples and we can't ignore that command.

The Column of Faith by Carly Moore

As has been shared with you recently, the session has adopted a new mission statement: Thyatira Presbyterian Church – A Living Legacy of Love, Faith, Service, and Patience Endurance. Now, we must decide what this means to us as a church. This is where our Vision Discernment Team comes in.



Faith is one of the things that gives us our identity, as God’s people in this place. Faith is essential as we move forward in living out the vision God reveals to us. We won’t be able to get where God wants us to go without it, but we must listen and be patient.

As I was thinking about what to say about faith, I started thinking about my own faith. I kept hearing the saying, “Just have faith,” or “Have a little faith” over and over in my head. I want you to think about a moment in your life when someone told you to just have faith.

The first thing that I thought of was the birth of my children. Addy surprised us all being born at 33 weeks. We were all scared and unsure, but have a little faith, Carly, I thought to myself. And, look at her now. Fast forward three years, and I was pregnant again. I was nervous about another early birth, but same story. McGuire was born at 34 weeks. I was angry and scared! How could this happen again!?! But, have a little faith, Carly, and look at him.

Through the years, faith has seen my family and me through many ups and downs. Very big faith moments, and smaller ones too. I want you to think about a smaller faith moment. I think about the deep breath that I take before I help Addy or a struggling student. Or the quiet moments at night when my children are sleeping, that is faith at work!

Now, let’s translate that to our church. A big faith moment like Mwandu. I love hearing the stories of Mwandu and the journey so many took together. I am sure they felt every emotion possible, is this going to happen?!?! But, they had faith. Or smaller faith moments, like when a hymn or piece of scripture, or a point in the sermon hits home. Or, the moment you decide to tutor or drive for meals on wheels, that is all faith.

Lastly, I was listening to the Christmas song “Do You Hear What I Hear?” and the last line says, “He will bring us goodness and light.” And, he will in so many ways, if we have faith :)
